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Students' Critical Thinking Skill and It's Relation with Knowledge and Experience at Medical Faculty Christian University of Indonesia

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Introduction: This study investigates the students' critical thinking and its relation with knowledge and experience at Medical Faculty - Christian University of Indonesia. It is done in order to find out the relationship among the variables and it was conducted at the Christian University of Indonesia exactly at the Faculty of Medicine

Method: The method of the study was correlational study and the sample of this study was 72 Medical Students which were selected randomly out of 250 Medical Students as the population of this research. Those students who were chosen as the sample of this study are still registered as Student of Medical on 2014/2015 academic year. The instrument used in this study is a questionnaire consisting of 34 questions. The data were analyzed by Skewness and kurtosis.

Findings: The finding of this study shows that there is a positive correlation among the knowledge, experience and common sense with the students' critical thinking skill. The correlation coefficient among the variables X1 and X2 with Y is 0.234.

Conclusion: It can be concluded that in order to improve students' critical thinking skills, the knowledge, experience and common sense should also be improved.
