Audrey Shafer, MD is Professor of Anesthesiology, Perioperative and Pain Medicine, Stanford University School of Medicine / Veterans Affairs Palo Alto Health Care System; Director and Founder, Stanford Medicine & the Muse Program, Stanford Center for Biomedical Ethics; co-director, Biomedical Ethics and Medical Humanities Scholarly Concentration; and co-founder of Pegasus Physician Writers. She is a graduate of Harvard University and Stanford University School of Medicine; her anesthesiology training was at University of Pennsylvania. Her courses include Medical Humanities and the Arts, a survey seminar series. She is the author of *The Mailbox*, a children's novel on posttraumatic stress disorder in veterans. Her poetry on anesthesia, health humanities and family life has been published in journals and anthologies. The Stanford Medicine and the Muse Program is hosting a yearlong exploration of the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the publication of Mary Shelley's novel, *Frankenstein*, including the International Health Humanities Consortium Conference in April 2018.
