Biography:

After receiving a degree in biochemistry at the University of California Berkeley, H. Carrie Chen completed medical school and residency training at the University of California San Francisco (UCSF). She subsequently held a faculty appointment at UCSF for several years where she was Professor of Clinical Pediatrics, a member of the UCSF Academy of Medical Educators, and held the Abraham Rudolph Endowed Chair in Pediatric Education. She received her PhD in Health Professions Education in 2015 and completed a visiting professorship at the Center for Research and Development of Education at the University Medical Center Utrecht in the Netherlands. In Fall 2016, she assumed her current position as Associate Dean of Assessment and Educational Scholarship and Professor of Pediatrics at Georgetown University School of Medicine.

She has curriculum development and leadership experience with pre-clerkship, clerkship, 4th year medical student, residency, fellowship, and continuing medical education as well as faculty development. Her research interests include workplace learning, workplace-based assessments including the use of entrustable professional activities (EPAs), and faculty skill development and support. She has published on the implementation of EPAs in undergraduate medical education and provided faculty development on the use of EPAs as well as other topics. In addition, she is involved with an Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC) sponsored national pilot in competency-based education that uses EPAs as the competency framework for advancing learners from undergraduate to postgraduate medical training and into practice.
