

Professor Ming-Jung Ho National Taiwan University College of Medicine Weill Cornell Medicine-Qatar

Biography:

Ming-Jung Ho is Professor of the Graduate Institute of Medical Education & Bioethics at National Taiwan University College of Medicine. She is also Professor of Medicine at Weill Cornell Medicine-Qatar and an Affiliate Scholar at University of Toronto's Wilson Centre. She earned a BA from Harvard University, an M.D. from the University of Pennsylvania, and an M.Phil. in Ethnology and Museum Ethnography from the University of Oxford, where she also received a D.Phil. in Social Anthropology. She taught at Chang Gung University and National Yang Ming University before joining National Taiwan University, where she has won several teaching awards.

Ming-Jung Ho's academic interest lies in the application of anthropology to medical education. Her research projects on the theme of cultural competency and professionalism have garnered awards from the Association for Medical Education in Europe, the Taiwan Association of Medical Education, and the National Science Council of Taiwan. Dr. Ho is also recognized for her organization of national faculty development workshops in Taiwan to promote humanism in medicine. She serves on the Taiwan Medical Accreditation Council, the Association for Medical Education in Europe as International Relations Officer, and the International Editorial Board of *Medical Education*. She is also an Associate Editor of *BMC Medical Education*.

Ming-Jung Ho is a musician, having won national championships in piano and musical composition before entering professional schools. She is also active in global health, having facilitated medical student participation in service learning projects in China, India, Malawi, Nepal, and the Solomon Islands, among other locales.
