Biography:

He is a graduate of The University of Hong Kong in 1981 and is a forensic pathologist by training. He joined the Department of Pathology in 1995 after 13 years of practice in the Department of Health. He was caught up with the energy and enthusiasm of the medical curriculum reform at HKU that led to the introduction of Problem-based learning in 1997. This exposure to education pedagogies and concepts encouraged him to undertake work towards the Certificate in Teaching and Learning in Higher Education awarded by HKU in 2000. He has been actively involved in the various planning and coordinating groups for the medical curriculum particularly in PBL, Special-Study Modules and the teaching of Medical Law and Ethics. He has also helped to organize autopsy teaching for medical students with the assistance of colleagues from the Forensic Pathology Service, Department of Health.

With the introduction of the “new” 4 year undergraduate requirement in Hong Kong and at HKU, he has offered a 6 credit-unit Common Core Course in Forensic Death Investigation which is open to all undergraduate students at HKU.

He has been actively involved with the undergraduate admissions process and is Chair of the Undergraduate Admissions Committee of the University.

He has a diverse publication list on topics in sexual assaults, homicides, death and dying as well as medical education. He is on the Editorial Board of several leading forensic journals.
