Abstract

The use of surface anatomy has always been fundamental to clinical practice. With the introduction of portable ultrasound, there has been a rapid rise in its use in a range of different specialities. As such, there is a need to ensure that medical and health care undergraduate and postgraduate education reflects this service need. During the talk, modern approaches to anatomy education and the way of integrating ultrasound in the medical and allied health curricula will be presented.

About the speaker

Professor Claire Smith has been teaching anatomy for over 20 years. Claire is internationally renowned for being at the forefront of anatomical education, especially in the fields of pedagogical theory, understanding spatial ability and using innovative technologies, e.g., 3D printing and ultrasound. Claire has held various roles including Education Officer for the Anatomical Society, an examiner for the Royal College of Surgeons, Secretary General for the European Federation of Experimental Morphology and a member of the Federative International Program for Anatomical Education. In addition, Professor Smith is an Associate Editor for *Anatomical Sciences Education* and the lead author for *Gray's Surface Anatomy and Ultrasound*.
